Jeffrey Kaczorowski, M.D., *Senior Advisor, Children's Agenda*

Dr. Kaczorowski is a Professor of Pediatrics at UR Medicine's Golisano Children's Hospital and Senior Advisor to the Children's Agenda, an advocacy organization seeking to improve the health, education and success of children at local, state and federal levels. He is the founding Director of the hospital's Hoekelman Center and works with the Children's Institute to promote effective violence prevention strategies for children and youth in the Rochester City School district. He is the Co-Chair of the Rochester-Monroe Anti-Poverty Initiative's (RMAPI) Health and Nutrition workgroup.

Marvin A. McMickle, Ph.D., *President, CRCDS, Professor of African American Religious Studies*

Dr. Marvin A. McMickle, the 12th President of CRCDS, is a highly regarded preacher and prolific author of 15 books and scores of essays and articles. He is active on the leadership team of Unite Rochester, a social platform aimed at increasing racial diversity and reducing inner-city poverty. A member of the Martin Luther King, Jr. International Board of Preachers at Morehouse College in Atlanta, GA., Dr. McMickle is Professor Emeritus at Ashland Theological Seminary and has been a Visiting Professor of Preaching at Yale Divinity School. He earned a M.Div. from Union Theological Seminary, a D.Min. from Princeton Theological Seminary and a Ph.D. from Case Western Reserve University. Dr. McMickle currently serves as co-chair of RMAPI.

Milo Primeaux, Esq., *Staff Attorney, LGBT Rights Project, Empire Justice Center*

Milo Primeaux is a queer-identified transgender attorney who provides direct legal services to low-income lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ) individuals in the greater Rochester area on a variety of legal issues related to their status as LGBTQ. He is the founding Director of the Organization for Transgender Health Empowerment Resources (OTHER), a not-for-profit committed to increasing access to adequate and competent health care for all transgender and gender-nonconforming people. Milo approaches his work through a critical racial and economic justice lens, recognizing

that low-income LGBTQ individuals of color are most adversely impacted by systemic discrimination and require supportive legal services to help them overcome the compounded barriers they face.
